

Learn with Me!

String Telephone

Gather two plastic cups and a long length of string to create a string telephone. Poke a hole in the bottom of each cup. Pass an end of the string through the hole in one cup. Repeat with the other cup. Secure the string ends to the bottom of the cups with tape or a paper clip. Give one end of the string telephone to your child and keep the other end. Move as far away from each other as the string allows. Spend time together testing the sound and vibration over different distances. What a fun way to communicate!

Healthy or Not?

Visit your pantry with your child to talk about the different types of food there. Read food labels together and describe what unfamiliar items are used for. When your child has a good understanding of the items, work together to sort healthy foods from treats. Throughout the next few days, encourage your child to pick a healthy food from your discoveries to eat.

Recipe

Fruity Pink Playdough

- 2 ½ cups flour
- 1 T. cream of tartar
- 2 pkgs. unsweetened cherry, strawberry, or pink lemonade powdered drink mix
- 1 cup salt
- 2 cups boiling water
- 3 T. cooking oil

Review the color pink by making a batch of delicioussmelling playdough! Mix the dry ingredients. Add the oil to the boiling water and pour it into the dry ingredients.

Stir quickly, mixing well. As the dough cools, knead it until smooth. Store it in the refrigerator in an airtight container.
