Enjoy the sounds, sights, scents, textures, and tastes of springtime as you help children explore the beautiful and changing world around them.

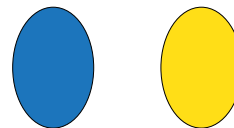
### Up & Away

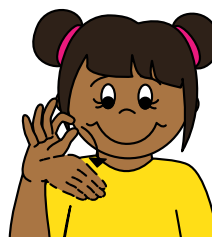
### Sunny Savanna

## Learn with Me!

### Toy Animal Safari

Hide some of your child's toy animals around the house. Invite your child to find them. As your child finds each one, name it, and talk about some of its features. Does it have a long neck? Does it have a trunk? Where are its ears?

### Bath Time Rain

Punch a few holes in a water bottle (*remove lid*) or another plastic container. At bath time, your child can fill the container with water and then watch the "rain" come out.

## Recipe

## Bunny Salad
