Ocean Life

Visit a local aquarium, zoo, the seashore, or pet store with your child. Point out the various fish and ocean life. If you don't have these local resources, read books about the ocean or do a search for ocean life images online. Talk about the colors you see.

Signs of Spring

Read a book about spring with your child. Look carefully at the pictures. What symbols of spring are portrayed in the book—rain, flowers, birds, bugs? Talk about the springtime weather in your area. Ask, "What signs can you search for that show spring is coming? How can you tell the wind is blowing?" Point out waving flags or swaying trees. Does the air feel warm or cold?

My Project: Sandy Starfish

When I bring this project home, we can:

- Talk about other places a star shape can be found.

Recipe

Green Pea Hummus

1 (15 oz.) can chickpeas
1 cup frozen peas, thawed and drained
¼ tsp. garlic powder
¼ tsp. salt
2 T. tahini
2 tsp. olive oil
3 T. lemon juice



Make a snack that matches the green color of plant growth in springtime. The green color of the hummus also makes it a fun snack for St. Patrick's Day. Add all ingredients to a blender or food processor. Blend until you have a smooth paste.
