#### **Curious Critters**



### Learn with Me!

#### Critter Observation

Use magnifiers to look for insects around the backyard with your child. Gather stickers and a notepad. Every time you spot a bug, attach a sticker to the notepad. Compare how insects look different with the use of the magnifiers. As you observe the creatures, talk about the changing weather and how the bugs might be preparing for the upcoming winter season.

#### Fairy Tale Dress-Up

Talk to your child about fairy tales and stories that are familiar in your household. Look in picture books and note particular colors or accessories that are shown. Work with your child to find clothing and props around the home that can be used to act out the story. Pieces of fabric from old dresses or shirts can serve as aprons, dresses, or capes. Tree branches or sticks could be used as wands. Invite your child to use the materials creatively to act out the story as you read. Invite close family members to watch and enjoy the big performance!

#### Pumpkin Shakes

- 1/2 cup frozen yogurt OR ice cream
- 3 T. milk
- 1 tsp. canned pumpkin
- 1 candy pumpkin OR candy corn (optional)
