## Learn with Me!

#### • Fire Prevention

Talk about what your child has learned about fire prevention during the Safety First theme. Record this information. #### Stick Alphabet

Go on a hunt for sticks with your child. Collect them from your yard or a nearby park. Help your child notice the different sizes of the sticks and if they bend in different ways. Model how to create a letter with the sticks while inviting your child to join you. How many letters of the alphabet can you create together?

## Recipe

## **Pumpkin Cheeseball**

8 oz. shredded cheddar cheese

1/4 cup canned pumpkin

1/4 tsp. allspice

1/4 tsp. nutmeg

4 oz. cream cheese, softened

Mix the ingredients until smooth. Cover and refrigerate until firm (about 2 hrs). Shape the mixture into a pumpkin. Use your finger to add lines down the sides. Add a pretzel rod to the top for a stem and decorate

the pumpkin with some of the following items: red or green pepper slices, black olive slices, carrot sticks or slices, lettuce or spinach leaves, parsley sprigs. Serve with assorted crackers.
