Your little ones will enjoy investigating the fasteners and mechanisms on everyday items. Toddlers will explore hands-on learning with zippers, knobs, tape, glue, buttons, and more. This theme highlights the many ways fasteners help humans in everyday life!

Recipe

Apples with Pumpkin Yogurt Dip

2 T. pure maple syrup
