Themes

Hello and Goodbye

Many children will be entering new childcare settings for the first time. This theme focuses on meeting the adults who care for them as well as playing with new friends, easing transitions away from families and back, and discovering fun things to do.

Orchard Adventure

Enjoy the sights, scents, textures, and tastes of autumn by visiting the orchard. In this theme, children will explore apples and leaves and learn about the equipment used to harvest fruit.

Safety First

Learn with Me!

Up and Down the Stairs

Many toddlers find joy in climbing. If your child likes to climb the stairs, take opportunities to practice it safely. Hold your child's hand as you climb the stairs together. Give your child a chance to climb as you follow closely behind. Say "up" when going up the stairs, and say "down" when going down the stairs. Practiced opportunities may deter unsafe solo explorations!

Leaves Exploration

Take a walk together to observe leaves. With autumn here, you may be able to appreciate the leaves changing colors. Help your child identify the color red and the triangle shape on leaves.

Recipe

Pumpkin Dip

1 can (15 oz.) plain pumpkin

1 (4-serving size) butterscotch pudding mix

1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice

1 (8 oz.) container frozen whipped topping, thawed gingersnaps OR vanilla wafers

Mix the pumpkin, pudding mix, and pumpkin pie spice

in a bowl. Stir in the whipped topping. Refrigerate for an hour or more. Serve with gingersnaps or vanilla wafers. As you and your child enjoy the treat, point out that the cookies are circles!
