Forest Adventure


Children will learn about forest life, including the plants that grow there and the animals that make it their home. This theme emphasizes forest appreciation and conservation.




• Friends

Ask your child what activities he did this week that involved taking turns. (Built a tower? Assembled a puzzle? Made a class picture?) Ask him the names of some of his friends. Look at pictures of friends and family. Talk with your child about how family members can be good friends too. Encourage your child to help at home, care about family members' feelings, and remember to say "please" and "thank you."

• Being Outdoors


On a nice day, take a walk outside with your child, or simply go out into your yard. Occasionally ask her to "Stop...look...and listen." When you say "Stop," your child should freeze in place and be quiet. Encourage her to look and listen for something and share one thing she sees and hears. Does she see any animals that might live in a forest?

Recipe

Porcupine Pears

pears
small pretzel sticks
raisins
peanut butter (optional)

Invite your child to create this fun snack! Cut a pear in half and place half on a plate. Give your child a handful of small pretzel sticks. Press them into the pear to represent porcupine quills. Offer raisins for your child to rest on the pointed end of the pear as eyes and a nose. A dab of peanut butter will help the raisins stick!
